

Please note:

It is the responsibility of the installer to conform to local building codes and safety requirements. It is also the installer's responsibility to obtain all necessary building permits. All of our straight aluminum railing sections 8 ft. long and below meet IRC building codes. The purchaser and installer should review the intended use of the products with a licensed professional engineer to determine code compliance. Durables® or its distributors shall not be held liable for improper or unsafe installations.

These instructions are guidelines and do not cover every installation scenario. Review all instructions before starting railing installation. The installer may need to modify the exact installation method to meet unique site requirements. Railing has been tested by PEI and meets IRC Construction Code Standards and IBC International Building Code standards.




Installation Tips:

- **1.** Applying paint, other than manufacturer's touch up paint, will void warranty.
- 2. A miter saw with high tooth count carbide blade can be used to cut the aluminum. Cut slowly and use all safetyprecautions.
- 3. Where the aluminum base comes in contact with dissimilar materials, make sure the point of direct contact between other material/surface has a factory finish or heavy coat of alkali-resistant bituminous paint or
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equivalent coating before installation to prevent corrosion, which is not covered by warranty.

- **4.** A multi-use adhesive, such as silicone, can be used to secure the post cap.
- **5.** If installing on a wood deck, the post must be fastened into the structural frame of the deck. It will not be strong enough if fastened into a deck board. Blocking may need to be added for proper support.

Included Components

- (1) Post and Base
- (1) Top Cap
- (1) Post Skirt

Not Included

- Fasteners Use 3/8" weather resistant anchors, lags or bolts (Note: Most wood lag and concrete
 bolt heads will allow the post skirt to seat properly. Ensure bolt head is not taller than 3/8" for
 proper fit of post skirt on post base.)
- Railing Kits (sold separately)

Installation:

- Step 1 Attach the post to a structural surface using the appropriate 3/8" fasteners for your installation. Since the fasteners differ based on application they are not included.
- Step 2 Ensure your post is level and plumb.
- Step 3 Install the post skirt by snapping it in place at the base of the post. It's important that the post skirts are in place prior to installing the railing sections since they are one piece they cannot be added after the railing is installed.
- Step 4 Install the post caps after all of the aluminum railing sections have been installed so that the post height can be altered if necessary.
