Tools:


- Hacksaw or metal cutting saw
- Drill
- Drill bits 5/32"
- Screwdriver
- Measuring tape
- Level

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Step 1: Locate and install stair rail post & stair bracket base.

- 1. Measure and locate all posts.
- **2.** Choose the appropriate fasteners to fasten the posts according to local regulations.
- **3.** Use a 1" thick wood plate to position bottom stair bracket base. Secure the bracket to the base of the post using 2 #10-1" screws.
- **4.** Position the top stair bracket base according to the bottom stair bracket base. Secure bracket base with post using 2 #10-1" screws.

Note: The brackets should be spaced 32 3/8" apart for 36" tall railing and 38 3/8" apart for 42" tall railing.




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
Step 2: Cut and install top and bottom rail.


- 1. Cut the bottom and top rail to fit between posts if necessary.
- 2. Mark the other end of the rail at the top of the upper bracket.
- 3. Insert the rail into the bottom bracket.



IMPORTANT:

When installing the bottom rail, remove the vinyl insert from package and install it as show below. Additional spacers may be needed.






Straight Railing installation

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4. Insert the rail into the stair bracket and slide it into base bracket hole.

Align the bracket and base, then screw the bracket with base using 1 #8-3/4" screw.



Note : Push the top rail into the bottom of top stair bracket, secure top brackets with rail using 2 #8-3/4" screws.

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Step 3: Install pickets and spacers.


1. Snap the spacer into place and insert pickets into top and bottom rail one by one as shown on the next page.

IMPORTANT: Install the last 4 pickets as a group and adjust the distance between the pickets BEFORE snapping the last 4 spacers into place.

Cut the spacers to fit the rails if necessary. To ensure equal picket spacing at each post, cut first and last spacers to equal lengths.

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Step 4: Install the post cap and post trim.

1. Install the post cap and post trim after all other components installed.

The post cap is pre-assembled with the post. Use a plastic hammer or similar tool to tighten it.

Install the post trim as following:

To install the post trim, place a drop of glue into each of the holes on the post trim (do not overflow). Fasten the post trim and press it tight about 6 seconds.
